How to avoid repetitive sentence beginnings

Readers will become bored if you keep using the same leads throughout your pages of writing. So experiment and try something different.

Beginnings to make the reader compare something:			
In contrast	on the other hand	after all	for that matter
At the same time	however	In the meantime	while this is true
Meanwhile	although	and yet	although this is true
Beginnings to help develop a sentence:			
As a matter of fact	for example	to illustrate	In any case
In any event	in order words	as I have noticed	while this is true
To demonstrate	In fact	at the same time	In order words
Beginnings to lead to reader forward and show time:			
After a few hours	Immediately after	And then	Previously
Later	soon	then	Afterwards
Beginnings to show addition:			
Nor	Equally important	Furthermore	Next
And then	besides	again	Lastly
Beginnings to end or summarise:			
Therefore	Consequently	Hence	On the whole
To conclude	in conclusion	as a result	summing up
