As recommended by government all students will receive two on-site lateral flow tests (subject to written consent), 3 to 5 days apart, prior to the start of the Autumn Term 2021 in September. Parents have been notified as to the dates and times each year group will be tested. Following the initial on-site tests, students will be able to collect their home test kits and will be expected to continue **twice weekly testing at home**, until the end of September when this will be reviewed. Staff should also continue to test twice weekly.

NHS Test and Trace plan to introduce new lateral flow devices (Innova, Orient Gene or Acon Flowflex) to make testing quicker, easier and more accessible. Orient Gene and Acon Flowflex self-test kits both require nasal only swabs.
